3. Chairperson's Report 2024

This means that it is a balancing act between growing the game in Munster whilst making sure we are mindful of our existing clubs and players to ensure they still have access to a great product within our leagues. To that end we need to nurture our youth providing a clear pathway and help our premier division to thrive to fulfil our aim of producing home grown local Reds players.

I would really like to thank the board for their tireless work over the past year. I would really appreciate the work that the committees have done for the benefit of all. We would be lost with the efforts of the Operations Committee and the Pathways Committee have ensured that so much youth cricket for girls and boys has been played and will continue to be played. I would also like to thank the umpires. A really tough job as anyone who has ever done it will agree.

I would like to thank all the staff. It is fantastic to have Joe working tirelessly developing vital relationships with the decision makers in Cricket Ireland making sure that we get our fair share and support from up high. It was great to see Rory, Hugh and Glenn on board and settling in so quickly and making great contributions in growing our game in the province. Thanks to Joe as ever and on the playing side, my gratitude to Jeremy Bray bringing so much to the coaching that is available to our players. As I look back on the last three years my highlights would be that we managed to get tax exemption from the revenue thanks to amazing work from Nigel Hickey. I am thrilled that we managed to get the women's super league up and running, with some great work from Maria and the Women's and girl's committee there. We managed to play the first inter pro game against Connaught and we managed to get an agreement that we could get over aged local players representing the heat. This is fantastic for those players and also for the youngsters that learn so much from them . The PnP committee put amazing work in to get more youth games played than we ever have.

I would also like to thank the operations committee for the amazing work they have put in over the last few years and a special thank you to Joe O'Mahony for the incredible service he has given to the MCU.

There are so many people that I am grateful for the past three years and if I have forgotten to mention anyone please forgive me. It is time for me to move on and I wish the new chair and board all the very best of luck for the future and look forward to seeing cricket grow and thrive in our province.

4. Secretary's Report 2024

2024 was another big growth and challenging year for the union both on and off of the cricket pitch.

The 2024 MCU Board was formed in February and saw many new members joining, including myself, while some were continuing from the previous year. The Board has met online on eight occasions and had one in person meeting during its term with many other Committee and Executive meetings occurring weekly and monthly as well. I started my term as Secretary of the Union and Rashi Mukhopadhayay was brought in as Treasurer. Richard Brewster continued on as chair. Jack Filen, continued as MCU President and joined the Board in an executive role. Sukhi Byrne continued as an independent director before being made Munster's Cricket Ireland board representative taking over from Jack Filen who covered our open vacancy. Kevin O'Sullivan continued on the Board as Chair of the Operations' Committee along with Tom Maxfield who chairs the Pathways and Participation Committee. Chris Thomas continued on his term as Independent director. Thomas Raju joined as an independent director. Maria Van de Munckhof joined the board as chair of the Women's and Girls committee.

One of the big changes in 2024 was becoming a Tax exempt company. We held an EGM in April to pass a resolution to amend our constitution. This will allow us to invest more funds back into the game in Munster.

We reached out to clubs in 2024 to ask what should be the main focus for our strategy going forward. Overwhelmingly we kept getting told that junior cricket needs to be at the forefront of our strategy going forward. Under the pillars of Cricket Ireland's framework we have implemented this into our strategy going forward.

I'm delighted to see the Women' up and running and I'm looking forward to it continuing to grow as more teams and players hopefully come on board.

2024 was a big year for our staff as well as we had Len Browne continue as our operations manager, Joe Moynihan continue as General manager and Jeremy Bray continue as Reds and Heat head coach. Glenn Bronkenshire joined as programme coordinator. Rory O'Reilly joined as the regional development officer for Waterford, Cork and Kerry. Hugh Harvey - Kelly joined as the regional development officer for Limerick, Tipperary and Clare. We really took a big step in investing in youth cricket in 2024 and I am very much optimistic that we have the right people to help grow and develop our young talented cricketers.

We held our annual awards recently and it was great to see such a huge attendance and representation of the different clubs across Munster.

While the majority of our board is continuing on for 2025 I would like to thank Tom, Richard and Chris for their hard work over the past 12 months and years before with the board.

Finally I would like to wish all clubs, players, staff, umpires, Groundskeepers, parents, scorers, coaches, volunteers and our provincial teams the best of luck for the upcoming 2025 season.

5. Operations Committee Report 2024

Operations Committee Report 2024

The Operations Committee (OC) consisted of the following members during 2024;

- Kevin O'Sullivan (Chairperson)
- Joseph O'Mahony (Fixtures Co-ordinator)
- Declan Earley (MCUSA Nominee)
- Archisman Bose
- Jeff Hitchmough
- Leonard Browne (MCU Operations Officer)

The Committee's primary responsibilities as outlined by the MCU Board relate to competition structuring and fixture setting, club entry requirements, player registration, player grading, as well as drafting and applying administrative and playing regulations. The OC reports directly to the MCU Board and meets a minimum of 12 times per year with an increased frequency of meetings occurring during the period March - September. Operations has an overlap of responsibilities with the Participation & Pathways Committee, Clubs Committee and MCU Executive Committee and liaises on a regular basis with each of these bodies.

Competition structure & fixture setting

Firstly, I would like to thank outgoing fixtures co-ordinator Joe O'Mahony for his tireless work over the past decade in relation to fixture setting and amendments. This function has now passed over to the MCU Operations Officer as part of the

Cricket Ireland led transition to a professionalised structure and I wish Len Browne all the best in this challenging role.

Over 400 fixtures were scheduled in the 2024 season across adult, youth and representative cricket. In general club feedback directly to the OC and via the club survey indicated a strong level of contentment with the current adult fixture calendar. Several constructive suggestions were made by clubs, including incorporating earlier start times (starting in season 2025) and rescheduling fixtures when teams have been knocked out of cup competitions. However, the OC continues to experience significant issues with ground availability and this is limiting with regard to balanced fixture scheduling.

A split of Division 2 and 3 into an 'A' and 'B' sub-structure to accommodate additional teams and a promotion/relegation element was broadly welcomed by clubs, however the OC did receive feedback in relation to the repetitive nature of games in these divisions. This has been taken into account in the fixture scheduling process for 2025 but, as noted above, ground constraints are a limiting factor in this regard.

The fixture scheduling process for season 2025 involved a consultation with Premier Division clubs whereby the reintroduction of the Munster Senior Shield as an early season competition was agreed

by majority vote. Following the withdrawal of a 2024 Premier Division participant club, this competition will ensure that Premier Division teams retain the same volume of fixtures. I would like to sincerely thank clubs for their engagement in this regard.

Disciplinary matters and competition regulations

Regrettably, disciplinary matters were a significant feature of the 2024 season. While breaches of disciplinary regulations are under the remit of the MCU Disciplinary Officer, the OC received correspondence and informal feedback from multiple clubs alleging offences against opposition players or spectators. Feedback of this nature was also evident in the results of the club survey. The OC co-ordinates closely with the MCUSA however it is not currently possible to appoint umpires to every game in the province and the responsibility lies with clubs to ensure their members behave appropriately. This topic will be covered in detail at the pre-season meeting for club representatives.

Club entry requirements and support

Waterford Vikings Cricket Club was accepted as a prospective member of the MCU in summer 2024 and undertook the new entrant club process. Ground inspections, documentation checks and friendly matches were carried out and we look forward to welcoming WVCC to MCU competitions in season 2025.

Player registration, grading & NVPlay

Following engagement with clubs via the 2023 club survey and via direct communication, as well as engagement with other provincial unions and the MCU Board, the OC implemented the recommended 'club driven' new player grading plan. In general, clubs were extremely conscientious and complied with the requirements of the process, however a small number of clubs did not. Whilst this system is still in the process of being embedded, club feedback has generally been

positive with a record low proportion of players being regraded. Player registration via Gameday NVPlay continued to perform strongly with just over 1000 registered participants. However, the use of the live scoring functions regressed slightly in season 2024 with the Premier Division and Division 1 having fewer matches 'live scored' than in the previous season.

Conclusion & future actions

Season 2024 was a relatively successful one for Munster Cricket with a balanced provision of matches for all players across league and cup competitions. Whilst there were some scheduling difficulties, in general players received sufficient opportunities to play and this was borne out in the survey results. The updated competition regulations, administrative regulations and player grading process embedded well and increased interaction with Cricket Ireland on administrative matters was welcome.

The need for more clubs to participate at the higher levels (specifically Premier Division) remains a challenge and the incoming OC and Board will need to prioritise this area. The quality of playing facilities is an associated focus area and I would encourage the Board to assist clubs with investment in their facilities with the goal of providing suitable facilities to support player development.

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow OC members in 2024 for their help and support. We have a strong volunteer culture in Munster Cricket and despite the increasingly professionalised environment of cricket administration, it is vital for our Union that we retain this culture.

6. Women's and Girls Committee Report 2024

Munster Cricket Union Women & Girls Committee Annual Summary of Activity 2024

Having been formally ratified by the new MCU Board of Directors in March 2024, the new committee began their activity.

Members of the MCU Women & Girls Committee are PR Officer Evelyn Maxfield (GCC), Chairperson Maria Van De Munckhof (LCC), Treasurer Rashi Mukhopadhayay (CCCC), Secretary Sahara Nankan (CCCC).

The committee chairperson also served as Director on the MCU Board of Directors in a representation and liaison remit for the operations of the committee during the 2024 period.

The committee activity involved a regular monthly schedule of online meetings, frequent communication also took place via text group chat, emails and telephone calls. Regular consultation work occurred between committee members and MCU staff and two MCU committees – Participation & Pathway and Operations. The committee is grateful to the staff and committee volunteers who took time to aid the work of the new committee.

The immediate and pressing work of the committee was the establishment of a competition structure for the newly formed and developing female teams in clubs of the Union. This work would not have been a success without the notable and close collaboration of Operations Fixture Co-Ordinator Joseph O' Mahony. The inaugural MCU Women's Superleague and MCU Women's Supercup competitions were scheduled and the committee worked on a final draft of competition rules with MCUSA rep Declan Earley. Three clubs teams played in the Superleague and Supercup competitions during season 2024, with Galway Cricket Club emerging as Superleague winners and Limerick Cricket Club winning the Supercup competition.

In its devising of the Women's Superleague and Supercup the committee worked to a guiding principle of ensuring a female youth participation in the games. The agreed rules allowed for teams with girls aged 11+ with some hardball experience as eligible to enter the women's competition. As a result, the inaugural season 2024 saw a significant number of girls playing among the participating teams.

In its interests in ongoing development of girls' participation in club cricket, the committee has maintained close connection to the work of the MCU SCEO staff and Programmes Co-Ordinator. This intensive work and investment are recognised by the committee as being in a development phase, as the staff have been working in schools and community groups for less than 1 year. But the committee is keen to support and interface with the staff in the ongoing interest of developing an initial critical mass of girls playing cricket at club level & beyond.

For the winter phase of 2024, a schedule of winter training for girls and women across Munster clubs, was proposed to the board of directors and supported therein. Due to constraining factors of venue limitations, absence of subsidised funding as had been available in previous years and a notable deficit in the availability of coaches, the committee faced a challenge of keeping the schedule of winter training & development for women and girls open. However, with close co-operation between the MCU Operations Manager Len Browne and members of the committee, two blocks of mixed training for women & girls took place with adequate player participation to keep the cost of the programme neutral to the Union and importantly, fulfilled the demand by female players for their ongoing winter development. This programme is a body of work which the committee will maintain energetic interest in during winter 2025 and onwards for the platform it offers female cricketers to enhance their edge in their sport and for the comradery it offers female players from across the Union where there may only be at present one or two female members in a club.

Awards nominations and categories were also assessed by the Women & Girls committee for the MCU Awards 2024 and also for Cricket Ireland Female Player of the Year 2024. This work is notable in that it is again, a first for the Union to have senior awards categories for female players. Hearty accolades went to the recipients in Charleville, Nov 2024 when Women's Batter of the Year and Women's Bowler of the Year were issued for the first time. Alongside this the 2 women's teams, GCC & LCC also received their awards and medals for their victories in the women's competitions of 2024.

In a final word the MCU Women & Girls committee would like to welcome their first title sponsor to the grassroots of Munster Union's female game of cricket. Celtic Spirit Cheer & Dance Company have agreed to sponsor the Celtic Spirit Women's Supercup competition 2025. This is an exciting new dimension to the committee's work, and they look forward to a successful and fun relationship with Celtic Spirit Cheer & Dance Co in the time ahead.

The committee feel assured as they step forward to their second year of work, that they have made good friends across the province and received tremendous support all round and it is indeed a good feeling for the four volunteers.

8. Staff Reports 2024

CEO Report 2024

Since I was appointed CEO in June 2022 progress has been made in some key areas of business. The following report outlines the key areas of responsibility the CEO covers, highlighting some of the achievements that have been delivered during the 2024 year.

The report is divided into sections outlining areas of responsibility, delivery of activity and achievements The CEO focused on continuing to provide an opportunity for the union to grow and develop.

This included

- Referencing the Strategic Plan and working towards achieving these goals
- Working with relevant partners
- Communicating and developing stakeholders .
- Governance the Union was incorporated and progress continues to be made to ensure good governance structure in the MCU, with regular reports provided to the Board on this.
- Staff recruitment of development staff was 4 full time staff in 2024 due to the A new office was purchased in June 2024 and was relocated to Cork Harlequins until we find a future home for the MCU.
- Financial Management and Control the use of Stripe, Jotform and BrightBooks financial package are used to manage money coming in and out of the union and to keep records. The use of Gameday/Sports80 going forward will manage more functions Registrations, Coaching courses, Smash it / Its Wicket programmes, Winter Programmes etc. This will make the management more efficient going forward. The recruitment of a part time Accountant was a huge step forward for the union in 2024.
- Budgets set against ongoing KPIs and Strategic Goals
- Reports work continued to ensure effective planning and preparation of relevant reports. CricEval is now in place for reporting
- Sponsors a package was developed, I hope the Commercial Committee may be reformed under the new board and help develop support for the Union.
- Stakeholder/Partnership Management The CEO role continues to lead on managing and developing key partnerships for the Union to collaborate with. Some of these partnerships required significant time and investment during this period.
- Local Sports Partnerships Increasing participation and volunteer programmes with the aid of the Local Sport Partnerships throughout Munster. Schools programmes and other programmes in association with the LSP's are going to be key to developing the region. Contracts with 2/6 LSP's have been signed for 2024

Local Councils - Meeting for proposal of use of land going forward and helping local clubs develop. Opportunity to be able to acquire access to facilities to increase opportunity for cricket to develop going forward is still ongoing. A land ask is currently lodged with Cork City Council from November 2019. This includes a home for the MCU and spill over grounds to help the Union develop and fulfil more fixtures.

Douglas Community School - access to hall for the Winter as High Performance area for MCU in the short - medium term. It is used for all our representative teams in the Winter and for Specific training during the Season. The MCU are hoping to purchase a venue to develop in 2025.

- Cricket Ireland A large volume of work was required to ensure the Union was appropriately represented on a range of groups covering various topics. This included contributions to the following Cricket Ireland groups during this period:
- -Senior Management Group
- -Match Allocation Group (MAG)
- -Interpro Working Group
- -Operations Working Group
- -Development Officer joint task force.

The bulk of work during this period with Cricket Ireland was focused on developing an all island approach. This took a huge amount of time by CI staff, Provincial Union CEO's, and others.

In addition, regular meetings and communication occurred between General Managers/CEO's from all Provincial Unions to ensure similar approaches were taken, where possible throughout Ireland.

Finally, 2024 was the final year in which Ted Williamson was involved with the Munster Cricket Union. We thank you Ted for all your input over the last few years and there will be a large hole to be filled after you've stepped away. Thanks Ted for all your work over the years.

Summary

A very busy year both on and off the pitch. I hope to help the Union develop further in 2025 with the help of the MCU board, Cricket Ireland and the possibility of a home for Munster Cricket in 2025 a very realistic goal.

I would like to thank outgoing Board members and committee members for all their Help to all the committee stepping down after many years of service. Thank you and your support will be sorely missed.

Annual Report- National Programmes 2024/25

As we head towards 12 months of having a National programme Co-ordinator role at the MCU, it's worth reflecting on some of the highlights of the last 9 months of work within the Union.

2025 Sponsorship Package: worked with Joe Moynihan to create an updated and expanded sponsorship package to present to potential sponsors. There is a significant opportunity to bring revenue to the MCU with a suite of quality corporate partners, and we now have the platform to go forward and identify our alliances. Updated in February with inclusion of new Shield competitions

CI Programmes Smash It and It's Wicket Attended Activator training at Greystones CC along with Hugh Harvey-Kelly.

Worked with clubs across the MCU to grow the venues presenting the programmes. From 2 clubs in 2023 (Limerick CC and Cork County CC), we had 5 clubs in 2024 who committed to engage in running camps/weekly sessions:

Limerick CC
Cork County CC
Cork Harlequins CC
Lismore CC
Limerick Blasters CC

In addition, Clonmel CC (visited) and Nenagh CC have indicated they will participate in the programmes either later this year, or next season. Waterford and Districts CC and Co. Kerry CC are problematic, but I remain hopeful they will engage. UCC is not applicable as a student-based club, no response from Midleton CC. *Notes:* Lismore CC (Dan Dixon main contact) fully engaged and realise the potential of creating a youth section. Small but energised team. Completed F2F training session with 4 Activators on site in advance of their weekly camps. 20+ children signed up.



- Limerick Blasters CC (Thomas Raju and Rex Regis main contacts). Have never had a youth section. Now have 20+ signed up for their first camp to be run in July.
- Cork County CC/Cork Harlequins CC/Limerick CC: Clubs recruiting, numbers TBA. Activator training dates TBC.
- Waterford and Districts CC have membership and facility challenges. Ben Martin has created a business development plan for the club.
- Co. Kerry CC. There appears to be a level of confusion/communication issues at the club. Will develop relationship and ascertain the way forward vis a vis programmes (since taken on with the appointment of Rory O'Reilly. Conducted interview with Munster Reds Coach Jeremy Bray, presented podcast-style. Covered Munster Women and Girls T10 Superleague. Presented 'Club Focus' pieces on Lismore CC, Co. Kerry CC and Cork Harlequins CC. Covered IP20 and IP50 matches involving the Munster Reds. CI have indicated they want me to cover all Reds/Senior Cup matches etc going forward.

All social media metrics for X/Facebook/Instagram are trending in a positive direction, with more followers and engagements.

Participated in Corks Sports Partnership's Sport on the Green, where a 6 week programme delivered cricket to over 1000 children across the city. This was a major success and served as a springboard to the heightened profile of the MCU in the community.

Organised MCU mascots for Ireland Women vs Sri Lanka and Ireland Women vs England matches and attended. Fantastic PR for the MCU. Events photographed and added to the MCU library of images. Covered Irish and Senior Cup Finals at The Mardyke as MCU photographer, uploading real-time images and updates of scores. Covered the MCU Senior Cup Final at the Mardyke. Rain affected-rescheduled for 1st September

Covered Munster Reds vs North West Warriors and took c1000 photographs for use by the MCU and published by Cricket Ireland.

Interviewed on HBTV during Reds vs Warriors

Covered MCC vs Munster Heat matches and took c800 photographs, uploaded to MCU website and social media platforms.

Covered the U13 All Ireland Semi Finals (2) and Final at The

Mardyke/Farmers Cross. The CI photographer did not show up, so covered all 3 matches- Bready CC vs Phoenix CC, Limerick CC vs Instonians CC, and the Final between Instonians and Bready. C2000 photographs, submitted to CI and used on our own social media platforms.

Completed master document in conjunction with SCEOs to ensure consistency in service delivery in the schools environment. Worked on this collaboratively and presented to GM 17th October for feedback. Now finalised, we will have a firm framework that all Dev Offrs can work from when approaching and engaging with Sports Partnerships, schools, and community groups. Held a series of meetings with SCEOs Rory and Hugh to develop the framework for programme content and delivery. Subsequent meetings with GM and Ops Mgr agreed and ratified. Now in situ on MCU website.

Attended Cricket Ireland Strategy Roadshow at The Firgrove Hotel in Mitchelstown. Assisted in setting up and producing graphics for CI presentation. Photographed the event/edited images/created graphics and created social media reports and website content. Presented synopsis of my role to the gathering and participated in floor debates. Very positive event with good outcomes- well worth attending.

CricHIT: CricHIIT has the potential to become a key driver for recruiting new females into participating in cricket. I plan to roll out the programme in key clubs (Limerick CC/Cork Harlequins CC/Cork County CC) and other venues to attract potential recruits. It also acts as a revenue stream for clubs, so should be promoted and developed. To date we have held 3 series of 6 week blocks of CricHIIT classes, with plans for more venues. "Wicket Warriors" to be the male equivalent. CSP also wishes to expand CricHIIT as a female-only TY programme in schools.

Wicket Warriors: CSP supports a number of "Men on the Move" groups across the County. I originally intended to repurpose the CricHIIT programme to deliver, but could not due to copyright of the CricHIIT logo for use with female participants only. Have begun work on "Wicket Warriors" for male clients, which will be able to be rolled out by Sports Partnerships across Munster.

Attended Championing Female Leaders: On The Front Foot conference at Croke Park, a major landmark conference to foster and promote female leadership within the PUs and CI itself. An uplifting day, topped of with attending the Ireland Women vs England Women at Clontarf CC.

Attended Programme Co-ordinator's meeting in Kinsealy with Liam Foulkes, NCU, NWCU, CL. Rory O'Reilly and Hugh Harvey-Kelly also in attendance. Discussed programme rollout for 2025, principally a new programme to cover the boys 9-13 age group that is currently not serviced by Smash It or It's Wicket. Also discussed the success of CricHIIT in the MCU, other unions are looking at the possibility of following our model. The MCU is the only union in Ireland currently using the programme.

- Processing outstanding coach payments and settling Munster Reds expenses.
- Thorough budget review and planning for 2025.
- Processing invoices and managing financial reporting.
- Updating club registration and affiliation processes.
- Managing club entries for the 2025 season.
- Updating and maintaining cricket facilities at the MCU headquarters and purchasing new equipment.
- Successful installation of the new office space and management of office operations.

Reds and Heat:

The Munster Reds and Heat squads continued training in Cork and Dublin, with ongoing strength and conditioning programs. The Operations Officer oversaw numerous matches, including Reds Cork series and a Heat game against the M.C.C.

Event Management:

2024 saw the successful hosting of numerous key events, including:

- Cup finals across various age groups and leagues.
- Inter-provincial matches, including the Reds Cork series.
- Pivotal role in the All Ireland T20 tournament and All Ireland Cup finals.
- Annual MCU Awards Ceremony.

- Coaching Network Expansion: Reaching more coaches across Munster through effective communication and engagement.
- Knock-Out Scheduling: Finalising and addressing potential scheduling conflicts.
- Youth Development: Refining plans for Elite and Development programs.
- **Sponsorship Challenges:** Addressing the challenges of securing adequate sponsorship.

Future Plans:

- Finalise 2025 budgets and league structures.
- Continue to invest in player and coach development.
- Improve facilities and infrastructure.
- Strengthen relationships with clubs and stakeholders.

Personal Development:

Personal development remains an ongoing aspect of the Operations Officer's role, including continued engagement with Cricket Ireland and Sport Ireland initiatives.
